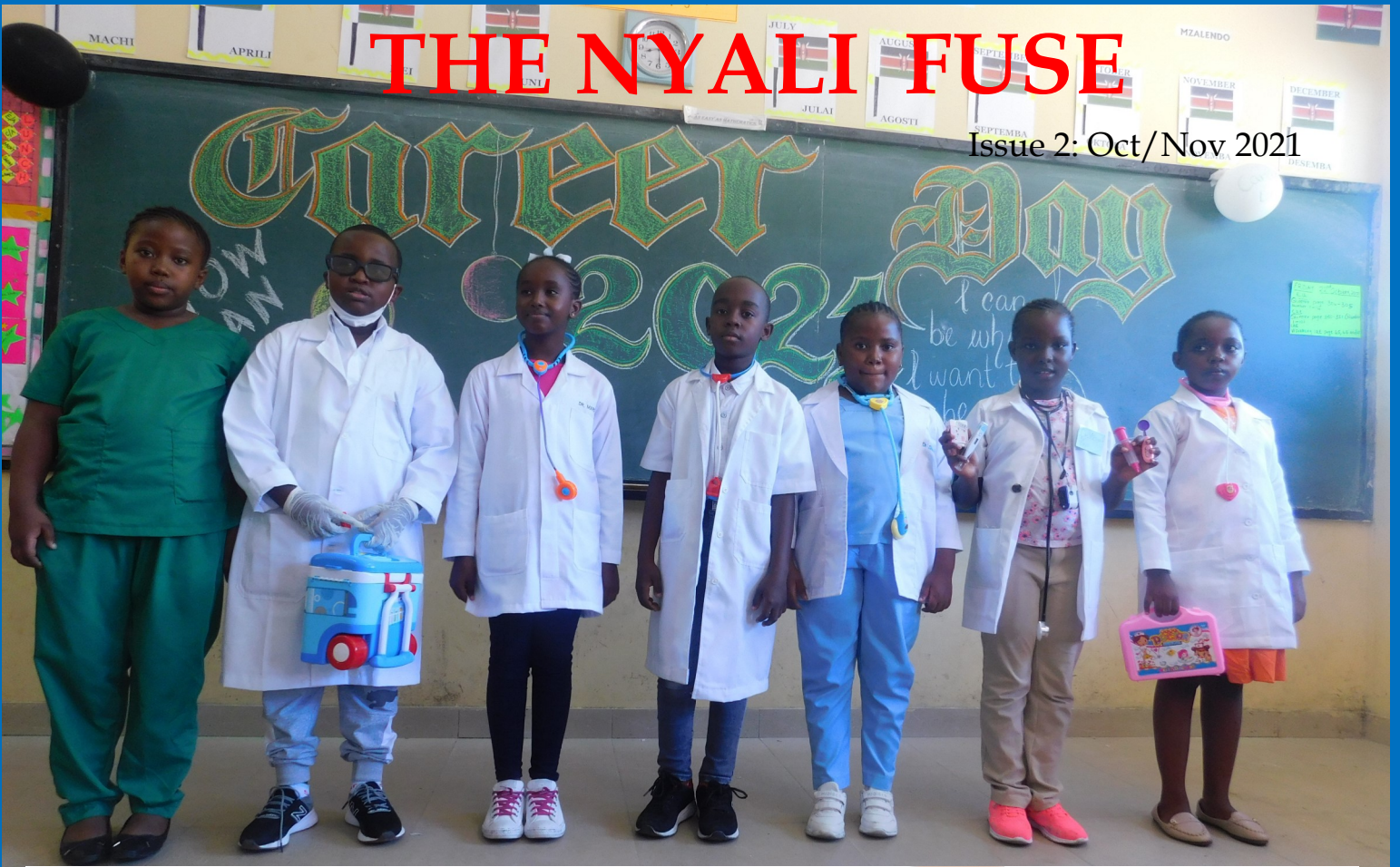

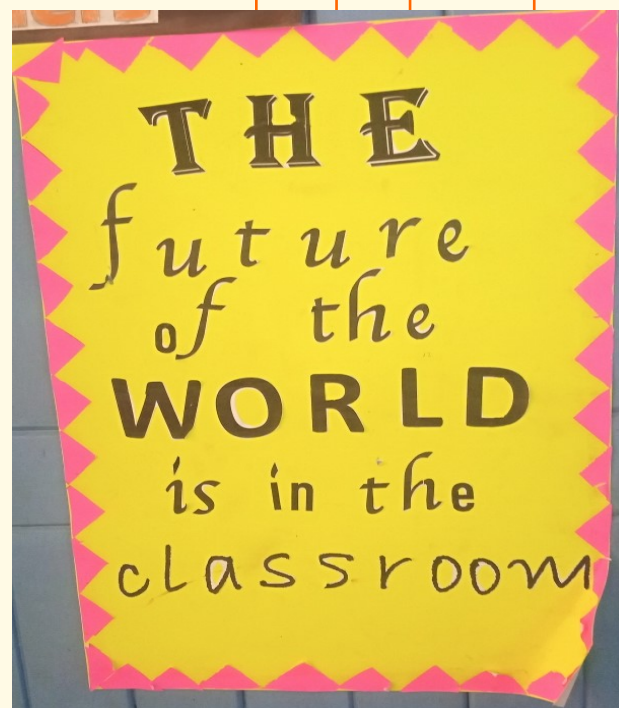


We are proud again to bring you the second edition of **The Fuse**.

Remember it has overtaken HIV/AIDS in killing our people. **WATCH OUT!!**

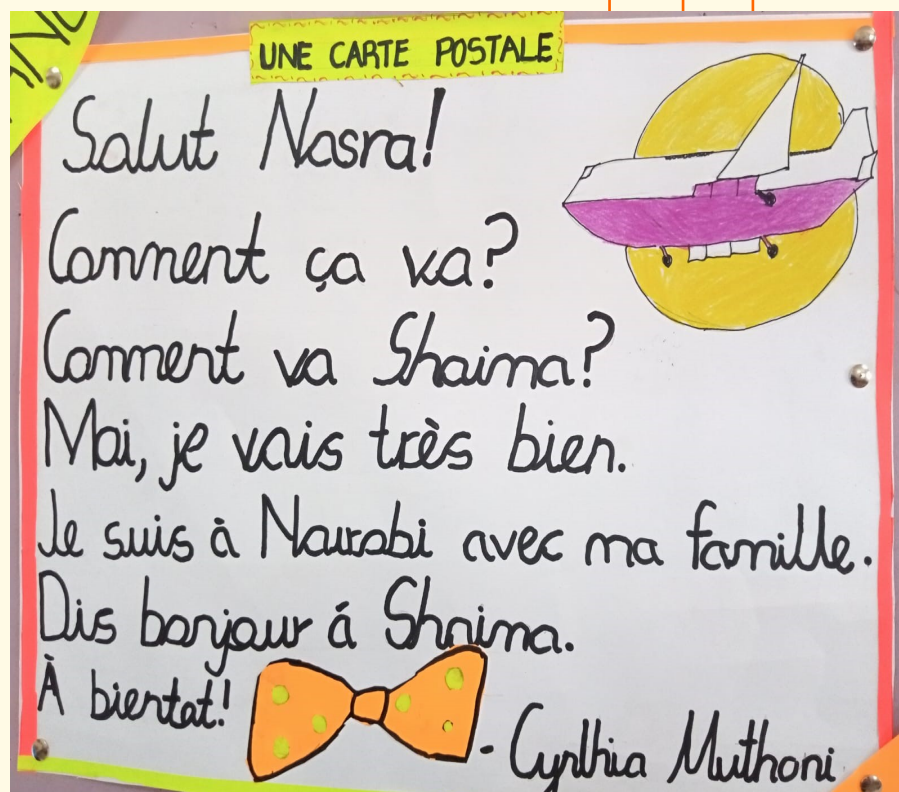
