Greetings to all honorable Members.

Happy New Year 2025!

First, we thank the Almighty God for successfully taking us through last year and enabling us to see this year. My prayer is that God guides us and blesses us throughout this year.

I would like to update you on certain aspects of the Club/School operations.

1. STATUS OF LEARNING

I am pleased to inform you that learning in our school has started very well during this term. Our teaching and non-teaching staff are working hard to ensure that learning is going on well and our school's learning environment is conducive.

As you are all aware, our Grade 6 candidates sat for their KPSEA assessment in October last year. I am pleased to report that our candidates did exceptionally well.

A total of 103 candidates sat for the assessment in five subjects.

I am delighted to report that our candidates recorded 276 (Exceeding Expectations), 550 (Meeting expectations) 282 (Approaching expectations) and 25 (Below expectations) in their subjects.

I wish to congratulate our candidates, our teachers and parents for making The Nyali School proud. Let us not forget that our candidates recorded this outstanding performance despite the unfortunate events that dominated the 2nd and 3rd terms of that academic year.

Fellow Members, this year we have our Grade 9 class learners who will sit for their national exams before transiting to Senior Secondary.

The Board of Management fully understands the task ahead of it and has ensured that our Grade 9 learners have all what is required to make them well prepared for their end of year exams.

Already, our Grade 9 classes have been furnished with new desks and learning materials and our laboratories are now fully functioning.

The Board is also currently reviewing the skills gap required by our teaching staff to prepare our candidates for their exams.

The Board is prepared to upscale the skills of our teachers if the need arises.

2. COURT CASES:

Mombasa High Constitutional Petition number E012 of 2024 is still ongoing and the matter came for a hearing on 20th January, 2025. However, due to time constraints the matter was adjourned to 5th March, 2025 where parties have been advised to file their submissions on the Petition for highlighting on the said date. Meanwhile, the team you elected freely and fairly on 16th March, 2024, will remain in charge of the Club affairs pending the hearing and determination of the Petition.

I am glad to report that many parents have overwhelmingly honored their fee obligations during this 1st term. Many others have partially cleared their fees while there are still others who still have fees arrears.


