In light of this, I would like to provide a brief update on key areas of our operations.

**1. ACADEMIC REPORT FOR TERM 1, 2025:**

### **3. SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE:**

We all acknowledge that challenges still remain with the current state of our school infrastructure. However, the Board of Management is doing its utmost best; within the limits of available resources, to improve and upgrade the facilities to meet the expectations of our school community.

We kindly ask for your continued patience and support as we work diligently towards creating a better and more conducive learning environment for our learners.

### **4. COURT CASES:**

Mombasa High Court Petition No. E012 of 2024 remains ongoing. Recently, the petitioner; James Madara, filed an additional application alleging contempt of the court orders issued on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2024 by the Board of Management.

In his application, the Petitioner claims that the Board of Management acted in defiance of the court orders by "firing and/or victimizing employees," and further alleges continued "mismanagement and misappropriation of the school and Club's assets."

While our legal team is working diligently to defend the Board of Management against these serious, yet unfounded, allegations, I kindly urge all club members and parents to remain calm and composed. Please be assured that the school and Club continue to operate steadily and remain resilient amidst these legal proceedings.

### **5. MEMBERS' CONCERNS:**

Dear Colleagues, as previously shared, I actively follow the School parents' social media platforms to stay informed about members' concerns. I must acknowledge that I have recently come across feedback regarding several issues affecting the school and Club and I wish to respond.

In our most recent Board of Management meeting, we discussed and agreed to convene the Annual General Meeting (AGM). I would like to inform members that the delay in scheduling the AGM is due to the ongoing Financial Audit of the club's financial records. Nevertheless, our Club Secretary will soon issue the official Notice for the AGM. In the meantime, I kindly ask for your patience and encourage all members to attend in large numbers when the meeting is called.

As you are aware, the Board of Management assumed responsibility for the running of the school in October 2024 and prioritized stabilizing the learning environment. As a result, some activities, including the External Financial Audit, experienced unavoidable delays. I am pleased to inform you that the external Financial Audit process is currently underway and is expected to conclude shortly. Once finalized and endorsed by the Board, the Audit report will be shared with all members. Furthermore, the Human Resources Sub-Committee of the Board recently conducted a comprehensive vetting process for both teaching and non-teaching staff. The purpose of this initiative was to assess the current skill levels, identify any gaps, and improve overall service delivery. The Board remains committed to promoting continuous professional development and capacity building for our staff. Unfortunately, during this vetting period, a few staff members voluntarily resigned, citing personal reasons. The Board is actively working to ensure that these



resignations do not disrupt the day-to-day operations of the school. This may involve recruiting qualified and capable personnel to fill the vacancies or implementing further staff reorganization as necessary.

Additionally, the position of Principal, which had remained vacant for some time, was formally advertised. The Board is keen to recruit a candidate who aligns with both the expectations of parents and the requirements set by the Ministry of Education.

I would like to take this opportunity to commend our current Acting Principal, who has performed exceptionally well and will continue to play a significant role in the academic leadership of the school.

Lastly, I wish to remind all parents and Club members that the Board of Management has adopted an open-door policy. Members are welcome to engage directly with the Board regarding any concerns related to the school or Club. Instead of raising issues touching on the Club on social media platforms, I kindly encourage Club members everyone to consider reaching out to the Board before instead of raising issues on social media platforms. This will allow constructive and timely resolution of emerging issues.

#### **6. SCHOOL FEES / MEMBERSHIP FEES:**

I am pleased to report that the majority of parents have diligently fulfilled their fee obligations for the first term. A significant number have made partial payments, while a few still have outstanding balances.

Dear Members, the school continues to face a considerable need for capital to support our ongoing rebuilding and development projects. These initiatives require substantial financial resources, and with your continued support, we are confident in our ability to achieve the goals we have set.

I kindly urge all parents with outstanding fee balances to settle them in full by the end of this month. Furthermore, I encourage parents to begin making payments for the upcoming term to ensure the smooth operation of school activities and to facilitate the continued progress of our development efforts.

Lastly, for those who have learners at the school and may have not become members of the Club, I strongly encourage you to regularize your membership status as previously advised, so you can continue to enjoy the full benefits that Club membership offers.
